- Recognition by the World Assembly


Adoption of the procedure for FMD official recognition

Countries and zone free from FMD without vaccination

OIE endorsement of official control programmes

HISTORICAL

The World Assembly of Delegates adopted the procedure for endorsement by the OIE of an official control programme for **FMD**

adoption of the procedure for endorsement of an official control programme for PPR

adoption of the procedure for endorsement of an official control programme for CBPP

adoption of the procedure for endorsement of an official control programme for dogmediated rabies



Endorsement of official control programme

The main objectives/incentives of the endorsement:

- to progressively improve the situation and eventually attain official recognition of disease status,
- to help the Veterinary Services to be provided some support from their government,
- for poorest countries, to help them to be provided some support from donors.








The dossier

Compliance with the *Terrestrial Code*

Complete –relevant template Questionnaire of Chapters 1.7. to 1.12. of the *Terrestrial Code* or from the OIE website

50 pages + appendices (properly cross-referenced) + executive summary

OIE calendar meetings:

- Cycle from a General Session to the following one
- Letter from the DG after each General Session
- 2 months before the meeting of the ad hoc Group



Processing for the ad hoc Group

Evaluation by the ad hoc Group

- Assessment according to the requirements of the Terrestrial Code
- Based on the information presented in the application and in other reports of the Member submitted to the OIE (e.g., WAHIS, PVS)
- Experts' knowledge and information available in the public domain
- Possible interaction with the applicant Member by telecommunication
- Recommendations for the outcomes of the evaluation of dossiers of applicant Members forwarded to the Scientific Commission



Evaluation by the Scientific Commission


- Members elected by the World Assembly
- ☐ Assess the dossier, including the *ad hoc* Group recommendations
- Possible interaction with the chairperson of the ad hoc Group
- Possible interaction with the applicant countries, including the possible visit of a delegation

/!\ official request to the OIE by the Delegate before 31 December

- Conclusion with a final recommendation for the World Assembly
- May request an expert mission to verify the dossier



Instructions

In accordance with Resolution No. 15 adopted at the 83rd General Session and other relevant Resolutions previously adopted,

- Member Countries having an officially recognised disease status or BSE risk status should reconfirm every year, during the month of November that remained unchanged.
- Member Countries having an officially endorsed control programme should inform the OIE during the month of November on the progress on the in the control programme.

Please find below a list of diseases for which your country has an officially recognised status or an endorsed official control programme.

You will be directed to the relevant annual reconfirmation form to be completed by clicking the link. Should you have any questions or problems complease do not hesitate to contact the OIE at disease.status@oie.int.

Suspension of a recognised free status



Immediately after the occurrence of an outbreak

Conveyed by the Director General to the concerned OIE Delegate

Published simultaneously on the OIE

Other reasons for suspension:

No annual reconfirmation

Non-compliance with the requirements



Maintenance / Withdrawal of the endorsement of an official control programme

(Non) compliance with commitments relating to the initial endorsement, especially

- non-compliance with the timelines or performance indicators of the programme; or
- significant problems with the performance of the VS; or
- an increase in the occurrence of disease that cannot be addressed by the programme

Withdrawal conveyed by the Director General to the concerned OIE Delegate

(No) compliance with the requirements of the Terrestrial Code


