# African swine fever: A global threat

- Increased and rapid international transmission in the last two years
- Currently present in Africa, Europe and Asia
- Massive socioeconomic impact in Asia
  - Region with the biggest pork production in the world
  - +6.7 million pigs culled between 2018 and 2020 (only in Asia)
- Small-scale producers are particularly affected
- Heavy international trade restrictions
- Threatens food security worldwide
- Transmission is mostly anthropogenic (with many actors involved)
  - Sensibilisation → prevention
- OIE launched awareness campaign in 2019 to prevent spread of ASF

# Campaign's objectives:

All actors involved are aware of and take the necessary precautions to prevent the further spread of ASF.



# Key messages:

- > ASF is a **deadly** disease in **domestic** and **wild pigs**
- > It is not a danger to human health but can cause severe economic losses
- > The virus is highly **resistant** in the environment and in pork products
- > There is no vaccine Prevention is crucial

# **TAKE PRECAUTIONS** to prevent the spread of ASF:

- Respect biosecurity measures
- Do not carry pigs or pork products when travelling
- Declare any suspicious case to the veterinary authorities

- Strengthen preparedness and response capacities to ASF of small and large-scale pig producers








# Biosecurity tools (GIFs, stickers, leaflet)



# Apply the good biosecurity practices



Secure the farm entrances. Maintain robust perimeter barriers and properly store food/water to prevent wild boar contact.



Take a shower or wash hands prior to and after visiting a pig farm.



Wear dedicated clothing and footwear



Strictly control staff and visitor movement on and off farm.



**Control** the entry of pigs by implementing quarantine measures.



**Clean** vehicles and footwear. It is important to remove all visible organic material before disinfecting.
