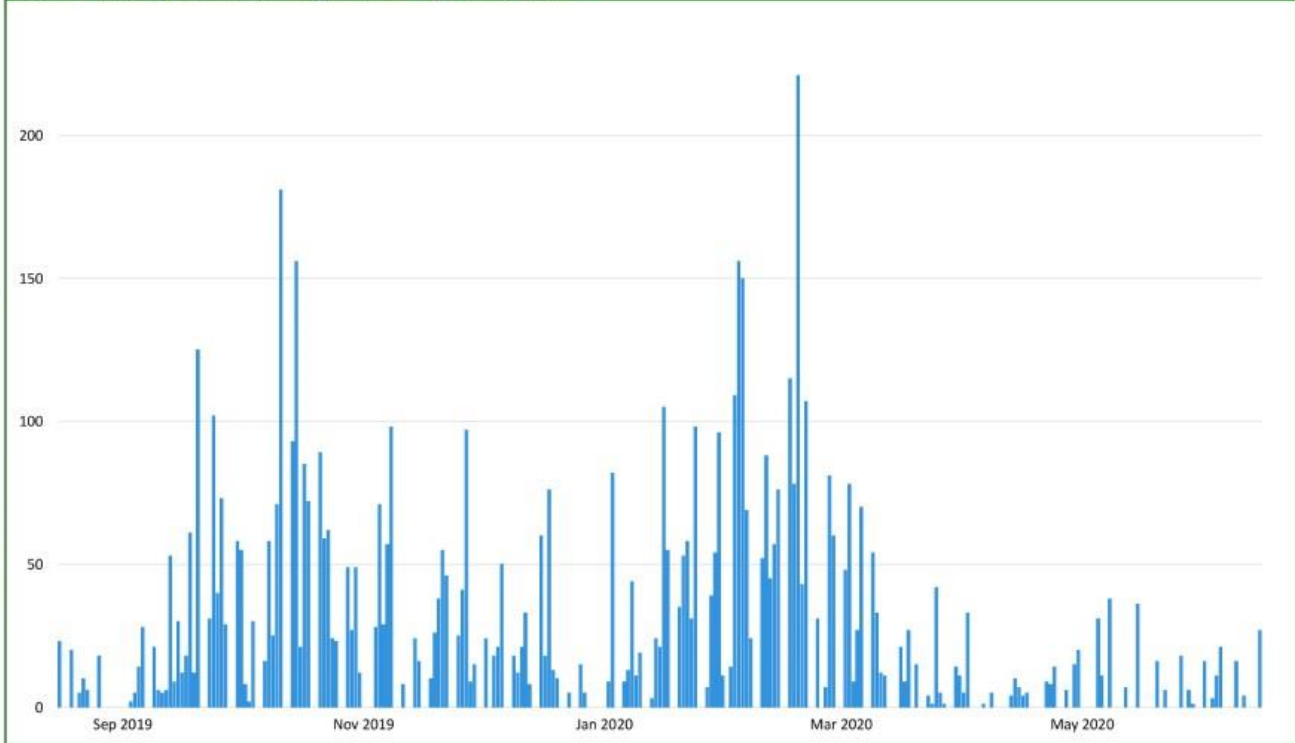

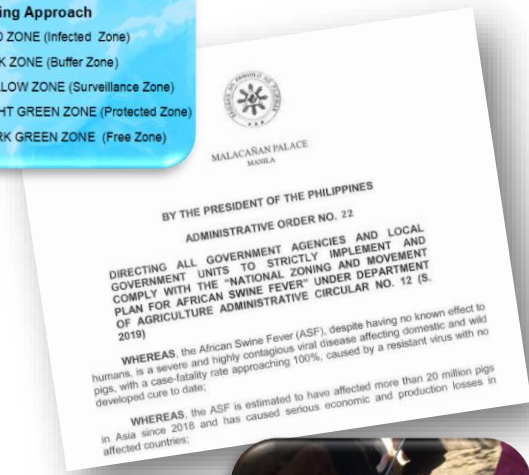
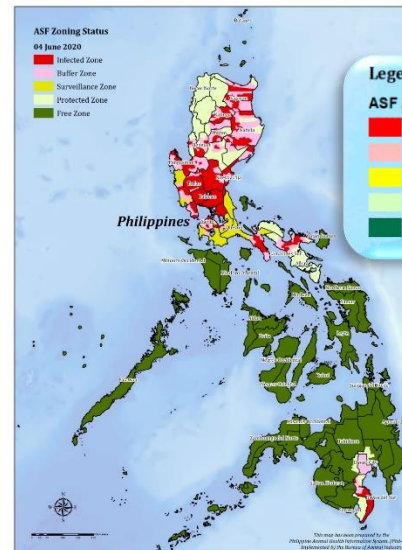
Whole of the Government Approach vs ASF

- Creation of an National Task Force on Animal-Borne Diseases (NTFAD) through Executive Order 105 series of 2020.



TASK FORCE VS. ASF. National Zoning and Movement Plan for ASF



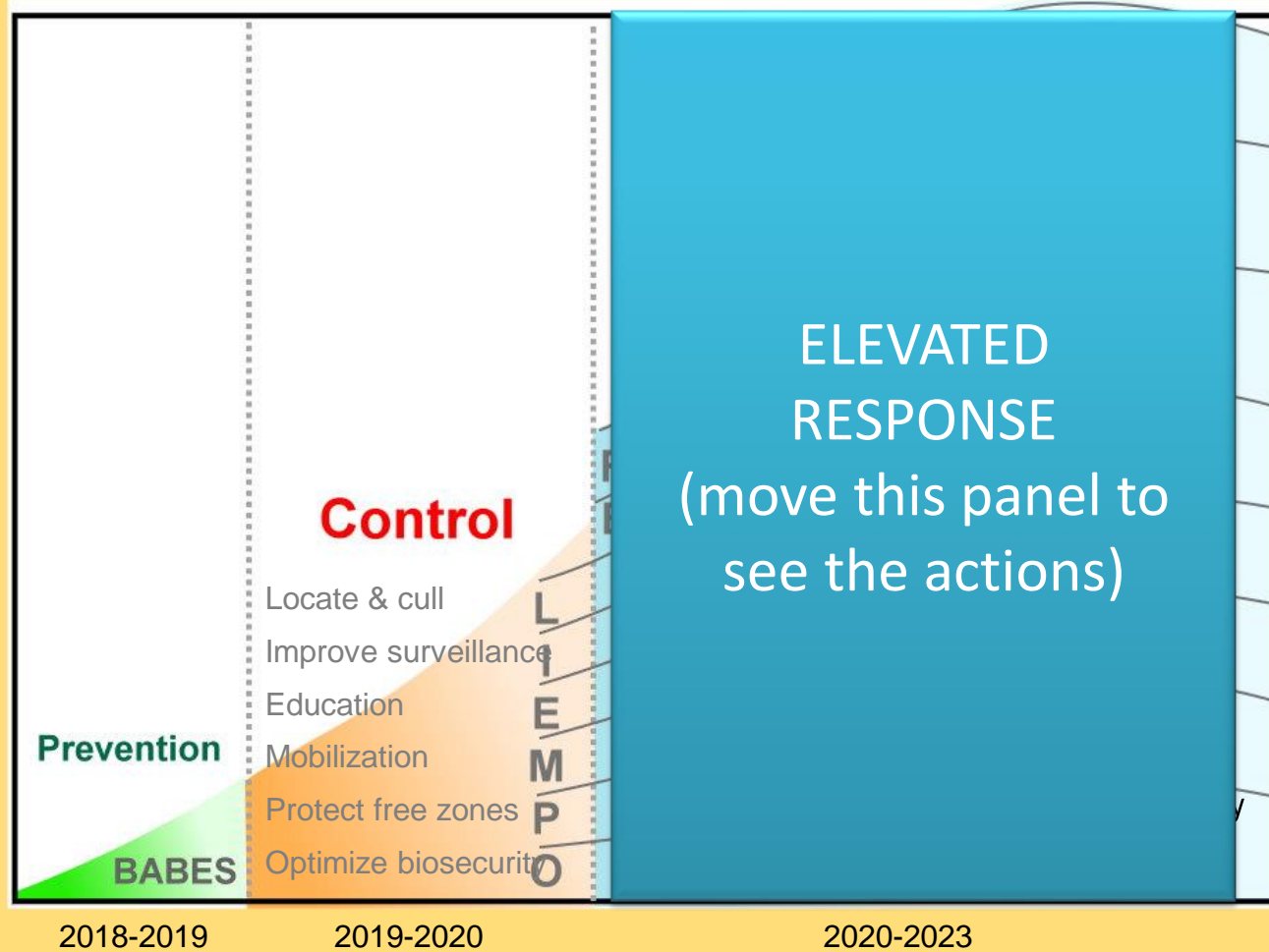
BAI ASF Control Task Force

Challenges Encountered in ASF Prevention and Control 2019-2020



Cross-cutting Issues

1. Social issue anchored on poverty

- a. hog raising using **SWILL** – as feed cost is prohibitive
- b. Consumer will buy cheap pork and pork products from community markets even without any documents of inspection – need to increase awareness

2. Economic

- a. Farmers selling sick pigs – to recover investment (backyard and commercial)
- b. Unscrupulous traders are always present (lowest farm gate prices-same retail price (or negligible decrease in market price))





Government Support for Affected Farmers

Expanded laboratory services (government and private sector)

- Laboratory testing for ASF for disease monitoring and surveillance by DA ADDRL and RADDLs
- Recognition of private sector laboratories for ASF testing

Indemnification fund of PhP5000 (USD100)/culled animal/farmer

- President's Contingent Fund for indemnification and operations – PhP800M out of PhP1B released
- PhP500M DA Quick Response Fund (QRF) – on standby for indemnification of affected farmers

Technical and manpower assistance for surveillance and depopulation

- Coordination of disease monitoring and surveillance activities and disease control activities by BAI, DA Regional Quick Response Teams, LGU ASF Task Forces

Loan Programme (DA SURE Aid)

- PhP30,000 for each affected hog raisers; Zero-interest and payable in three years

Post-outbreak animal recovery packages

- Procurement of animals for distribution to affected farmers (Cattle, Carabao, Goats, Range chicken, Layers, Broilers)
- Provision of alternative livelihood for affected farmers
