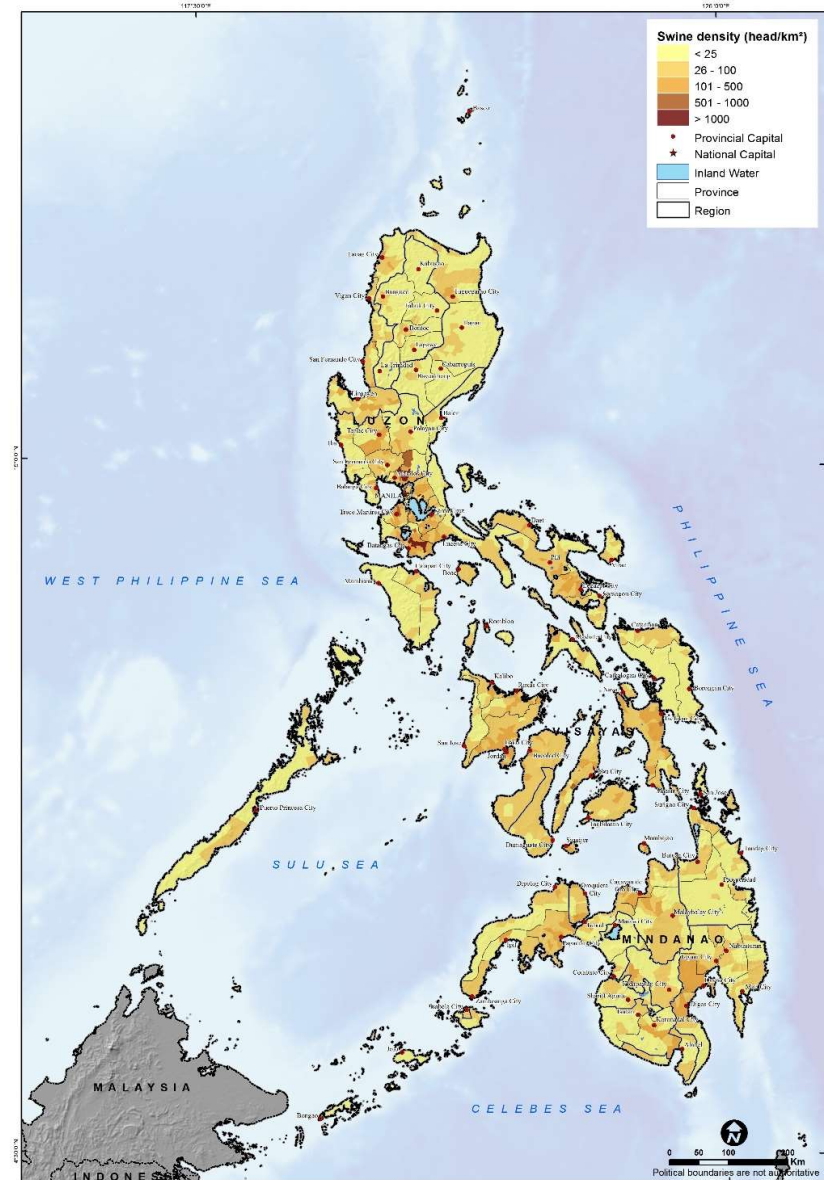
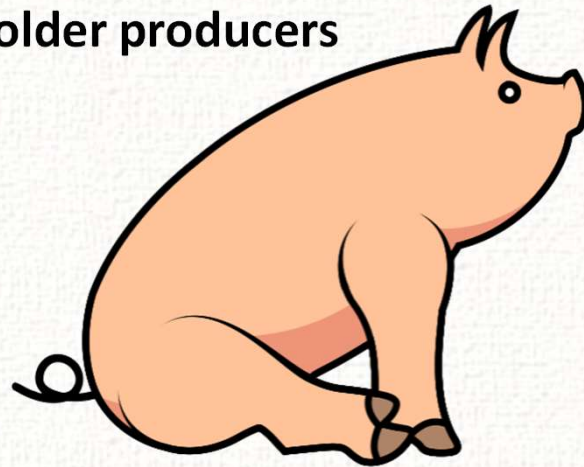

The Philippine Swine Industry

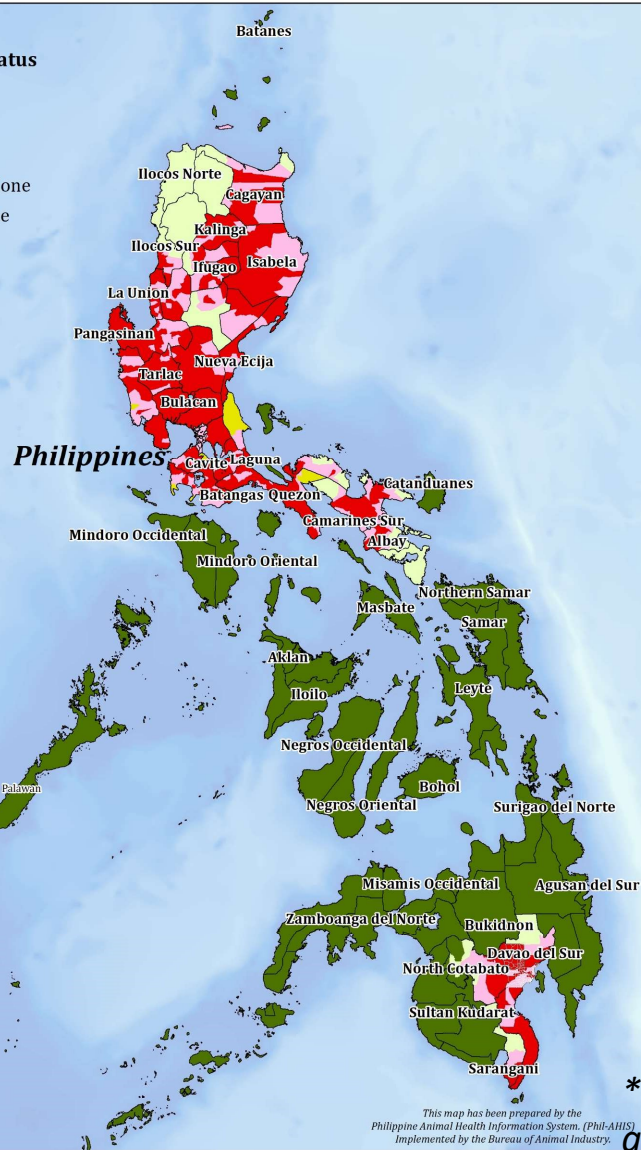
- Pork is an important source of animal protein
- Demand for pork has **historically** been increasing with an **annual per capita consumption** of **15.07 kg**.
- Social inclusion - **64%** of the 12.5 million swine inventories in 2016 was **produced by backyard or smallholder producers**

- Free Zone

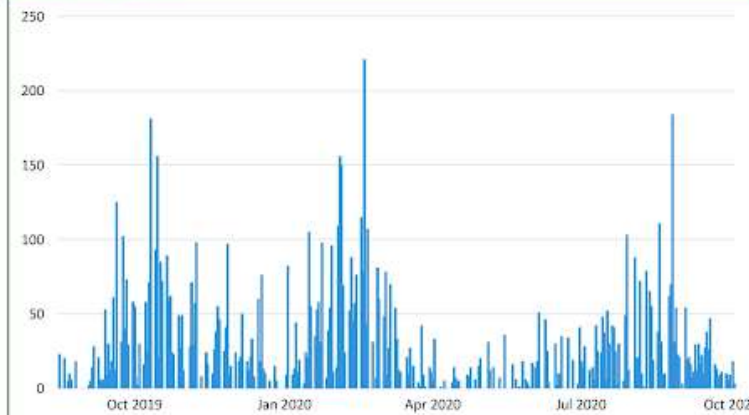
