



The Philippine Swine Industry

- Pork is an important source of animal protein
- Demand for pork has historically been increasing with an annual per capita consumption of 15.07 kg.
- Social inclusion 64% of the 12.5 million swine inventories in 2016 was produced by backyard or smallholder producers
